"I don't remember..."

There are so many things we'd like to remember, but which slip right out of our minds. Someone once invented a name for our ability to forget – it's the opposite to a memory, because it's called a "forgettery"!



It's similar to "selective amnesia". There are things that we remember perfectly well, but it's more tactful to pretend that we don't. Then we can bring our forgettery into play, by not mentioning things in the past which would cause embarrassment to those we're talking to. The past is past, and there's no sense in dredging up mistakes our friends have made. It serves no purpose, and spoils our relationship in the present.

Sadly, there are wrong things that each of us has done in the past, which we would rather forget about. In the Bible, we can read about God's very good selective amnesia. If we turn around and confess those things to God, he gladly offers us his complete forgiveness and the chance for a fresh start. Our forgiven sins are placed in God's "forgettery" – God forgives and chooses not to remember them.

Sometimes my memory is not quite as good as my forgettery.

There are some people who go round crippled with remorse. They can never forget the terrible mistakes they have made in the past. Because of this, they remain enslaved to the past, and can never get on with the task of living in the present. Whenever Jesus met someone like this, he said to them, 'Your sins are forgiven.'

Of course, nobody can completely forget the past. But if we decide to put behind us the things that have been forgiven, they no longer play an important part in our thinking. And when other people hurt us, we're called to offer them what God gives us: complete forgiveness and the chance for a fresh start.


We will be celebrating the 140th Anniversary of the Mothers' Union


with a special all-age service at 10:00 on Sunday 10thJuly.

Mothers' Union is a worldwide organisation promoting the values of Christian family life and is open to those who share these values. Members don't have to be married, be a mother, or even a woman our branch has 4 male members among its 23 members! Our meetings are at 20:00 in church on the first Tuesday of each month.

Over the years great emphasis has been placed on our work with children, even in feeding thousands of meals to Kenyan Street Children. Mothers' Union is a worldwide organisation and Chelmsford Diocese links in prayer and action with other Dioceses around the world.







St Paul's Christian Playgroup has been running for 24 years and currently children ranging from 2-4 years. We have a team of 11 dedicated staff as enthusiastic volunteers. We welcome children from all Faiths and celebra different cultures of the families that attend and our main ethos is on teach respect and tolerance for one another. Each Term we share stories from using props and puppets, craft activities, songs, preparing food to celebra occasions such as Pancakes for Shrove Tuesday and hosting a special ch service for families and friends on the last day of term. During our Spring children enjoyed stories about Jesus' early life and the miracles he perform ending the term with a service on Maundy Thursday. The children practise weeks learning new songs such as 'We have a king who rides a donkey' a hosanna' with the help of Jon our music teacher and guitarist. As usual th was full with parents queuing from 11am for a 11.30am start. Donnie led and the children had a wonderful time telling their families the Easter story drama and song. The children created a cross which was coloured black side to represent Good Friday and the other side was decorated with flow celebrate the joy of Easter Sunday. After a long round of applause from the audience they treated their families to an encore of their favourite songs. We were all so proud of them.





"Greater love has no man than this" **Battle of the Somme**1st July 1916 to 1st November 1916

If any one word has come to represent the horrors and loss of life during World War 1 then "Somme" must rank there at the top of any list. The Battle of the Somme, a series of battles along the Western Front, was fought to relieve the pressure on the French Army at Verdun who had been fighting this particular battle since February 1916 with very



high casualty rates. St Paul's has a connection in that two parishioners commemorated on the World War 1 memorial died on the first day of the battle.

The 1st of July arrives, the troops are lined in trenches ready to go over the top. The barrage ceases, whistles sound and out of the trenches spring the troops. There is a belief that nothing can survive the barrage and as promised they can walk up to the German trenches. The Germans exit their bunkers and begin firing at the advancing British troops who are mowed down in their thousands. The Germans cannot believe that the British keep advancing - and to our 21st century minds nor can we - but advance they did.


Two of those soldiers were parishioners of St Paul's, **Jack Goldsmith**, a Private in the London Regiment, and 2nd Lieutenant **Raymond Holcroft** with the Devonshire Regiment. Both died on the first day of the battle.

Were the losses justified? 100,000 dead or wounded for each mile gained or lost. In 1917 the Battle of Passchendaele resulted in about 250,000 British casualties and 400,000 German. Every soldier killed or wounded during World War 1 and all subsequent wars and conflicts is one too many - but that is the price of freedom and the defence of that freedom.

Lest we forget.
