Free Gift



If you happen to be in the right branch of M&S at the right time, you can get to taste free food samples. It can be hard to resist some of the delicious smells of freshly cooked food, and the invitation to try a few tasty morsels. The idea of giving away free samples is of course to encourage the customers to buy more food. We're bombarded with 'free' offers these days: free Wi-Fi, free loyalty cards from our shops, free pull-out magazines and of course BOGOF: 'buy-one-get-one-free'.

We tend to be rather wary of 'free' gifts and offers because, very often, there are "strings" attached – terms and conditions which must be met, requests for personal information we don't really want to share, and contracts we don't really want to make.

When we read about God's offer of life in relationship with him, it's often described in the Bible using illustrations of free food and drink:

"Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost." (Isaiah 55:1).

"I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty" (John 6:35).

"Whoever is thirsty, let them come; and whoever wishes, let them take the free gift of the water of life" (Revelation 22:17).

God lavishes his love on us as an unearned, undeserved gift. We are invited to follow his example: ***"Freely you have received, freely give"*** (Matthew 10:8). One of the practical ways we can do this is by sharing food with those who have little or none. Donations to Redbridge Food Bank through our church or through the local supermarkets is an easy way of doing this. You'll see, from our list of forthcoming events, that our Harvest Festival is due to take place on Sunday 8th October. This is another opportunity to give thanks to God for all the gifts given to us, and to bring donations of food which will be distributed to those who are in need.

St Paul's hosts a very special Concert.....

On 17th June ELHAP held a Summer Concert at St Paul's.



Natural Voices Choirs 'as seen on 'BBC's Don't Tell The Bride' gathered their youth and adult choirs for 45 fun-packed minutes of popular songs with singers from 5 to 85 at St Paul's Church. All proceeds went to ELHAP, a local Charity working to brighten the lives of Children and Adults with disabilities through their Play-schemes and projects. It was a beautiful summer evening and St Paul's Church was the perfect setting for what turned out to be a high energy evening. The audience made the most of the opportunity to sing along to many of the numbers and some of the ELHAP service users performed 'Singing in the Rain' alongside the choir much to the delight of the audience. There was also a very successful raffle with some much-coveted prizes such as paintballing tickets catching the interest of many of the younger choir members. The concert was a beautiful example of our community: a local choir, St Paul's and a local charity all coming together and raising nearly £1000 for a very worthy cause. It's SHOEBOX

Sunday 19th November

Yes - it is that time of year again when we start to think of the birth of Jesus and our good fortune.

Since Operation Christmas Child started in 1990, 124 million shoeboxes have been sent. For many years St Paul's has been proud to produce shoeboxes to go to children. This year, with exception and our service will be held on Sunday 19th November at 10.00am.

But shoeboxes don't just happen, that's your bit. It really is very easy to get started. Step 1. Find a medium-size empty shoebox and wrap the box and lid separately. Bring to church on Sunday morning from 17th September.

Step 2. Select an age range 2-4, 5-9 or 1-14 and decide girl or boy and attach a label.

Step 3. Fill with gifts. Fun toys, hygiene items and school supplies. If you have a doll or a deflated football with a pump.

Step 4. Make your donation. This year a donation of £5 per box is being sought. This covers the 17 countries to which shoeboxes are sent. It also covers training for the volunteers, the cost of the 'Greatest Gift' stories, and finally it resources the project materials.

Step 5. Bring your box to church on 19th November and be part of the celebration. It's a simple shoebox.

Because of where the boxes travel and the conditions in which the recipients live, avoid items such as toy guns, play soldiers or knives, chocolate or other food items, hand-made or knitted stuffed toys, anything of a political, racial or religious nature, playing cards of the four suit variety, clothing other than hat, scarf, gloves or cap.

I understand that the cost of completing a shoebox might be an expense to you. **September there will be a box at the back of church for you to put it in.** A bar of soap all that is asked that ALL items are new and unused.

As always my prayer is that we can make a difference to children's lives and that whether it is war or the desecration of creation. Surely they deserve a chance.

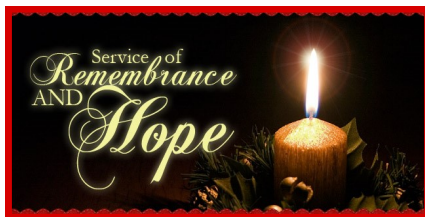
