Naming the Baby

New parents can spend a lot of time deciding on a suitable name for their baby. In the Bible, names often have important meanings. A person's name sometimes summed up their character, or their potential.



For example, Jacob in the Old Testament cheated members of his family and it so happens that his name, Jacob, means something like 'wheeler-dealer'.

Before Jesus was born, an angel appeared to Mary's husband Joseph in a dream, and told him that Mary's child was to be given the name Jesus "because he will save his people from their sins." (Matt 1: ²¹). The name Jesus is the Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua or Yeshua. The name means 'he will save' or 'God is salvation'. So the purpose for which Jesus was born was made clear right from the start, although at that point, neither Mary nor Joseph knew what Jesus would do or what he would suffer in order to save us.

In telling the story of Jesus' birth, Matthew' Gospel quotes some Old Testament words from Isaiah:

A virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him 'Immanuel' which means, 'God with us.'

Jesus didn't actually use Immanuel as a name, but linking that name with him tells us something about what he came to do – to show God's love and to show that God really is with us and wants us to be part of his family. God didn't just keep an eye on us from a distance; he not only gave us the gift of being with us; he became one of us. Maybe he could have simply appeared as a 30-something man to begin his ministry on earth. But he didn't choose to do it that way. He took on human form and was born as a small, wrinkled little baby just like all of us have been. It was the greatest gift of all - the gift of himself. That's a birth we can really celebrate.

He comes for us as individuals; for our society; for our world. An amazing gift for everyone!


