Don't miss the Baby!

This Christmas, let's make time to find out who this baby really is, what happened when he grew up, and why he came to us.



In all the busyness of preparing for and celebrating Christmas, it's very easy to miss the real "reason for the season". In the story of the first Christmas, there were a number of people who missed altogether what was really going on.

First was the inn keeper. Let's imagine that the inn was indeed the local pub, rather than the family guest room. If the innkeeper had known that the baby to be born that night was to be the Son of God, I bet he would have found room! But he missed the baby. He was just plain busy with all the other visitors to recognize that this baby was the promised one who would be the Saviour of the world.

The other travellers and the people of Bethlehem missed the baby too. This gift from God was right under their noses, but they missed it. They had their own concerns. **Don't miss Jesus by being too busy.**

The next person to miss the baby was King Herod, 'though of course he really comes into the story much later. Herod was scared of this new king because he thought that he would lose his throne and his status. He missed the baby because he was scared of what he might lose. **Don't miss Jesus because you're jealous.**

The last group of people who missed Jesus were the religious leaders of the day. They were people who should have been able to recognize when God was doing something special. They knew all about the prophecies in the Scriptures that the Christ would be born in Bethlehem. But they didn't even bother to go and check out Bethlehem to see whether this special baby, God's Son, had been born! Perhaps the waiting had become a tradition. **Don't miss Jesus because of indifference.**

Jesus Christ was, and still is, the Saviour of the world, the greatest Christmas present of all. This Christmas, let's make time to find out who this baby really is, what happened when he grew up, and why he came to us.



Shoebox Service 2019


You are amazing!

St Paul's Toilet Fund

We need your help

At the moment we have no toilets in the church building - the nearest are at the bottom of the churchyard in the church hall. This is very inconvenient for baptisms, weddings, funerals, our other church Services and social activities beneficial to the local community.

So we're planning to have two toilet cubicles, one fully accessible for mobility impaired users, installed in church at a cost of around £80,000 - costing this much largely because the church building hasn't got a sewer pipe outlet and the nearest connection for one to be laid is at the church hall.


